The Bailies of Bennachie

1. Topography of Bennachie

Bennachie, a unique mountain, surrounded completely by agricultural land. Its easy accessibility. 'Jewel in the Crown' of Gordon District - 'The Fuji-yama of Aberdeenshire', etc.. Panoramic view (? aerial) was suggested.

2. Geology

Geological development of Bennachie - Granite mass - weathering- tors peaks, etc. giving it its distinctive shape today.

3. Peat Deposits

Old Peat Road. Peat has provided evidence of the Old Caledonian Forest and previous vegetation. Still some interesting plants, e.g. Juniper, club mosses, etc.. Forest's destruction by man.

4. Man and Bennachie

Prehistory: Beaker graves; Recumbent Stone Circles (Aquhorthies): Hill Fort on Mither Tap: Maiden's Causeway: Symbol Stones (Pictish). Along with these might be incorporated Legends (Maiden Stone, Hosie's Well, etc..)

Maiden Castle; Pitfichie; Harthill; Lickleyhead.

6. The 19th Century Colonists

Crofting; granite-quarrying; drystane dyking; Division of Bennachie- evictions, Thieves' Mark- Esson's Croft - Esson's Grave at Chapel of Garioch.

7. Afforestation of Bennachie

Pre-World War One, during which many trees were cut down.

Forestry Commission work- opening up hill for recreation- car parks - walks -Old Aberdeen Turnpike - Gordon Way.

Mention might also be made of sheep and hill farming that went on between the wars.

Foundation 1973; Growth since then; Various projects; conservation work on Bennachie, etc.
