Proposed bookcases for H P Fraser Collection.

We have given further thought to the above and put forward the suggestion to make the unit with the lower portion 60" wide, 15" deep and 32" high with three panelled doors to lock. The upper portion would be made in three pieces each 20" wide, 12" deep, by 61" high, each unit to have a framed door with a glass panel and fitted with a lock. The whole would be surmounted by a cornice and would stand approximately 8 feet high by 5 feet wide. Adjustable shelves would be fitted to each portion. Blockboard would be used for the carcases and shelves, and solid timber for the doors. plywood backs to be fitted to each separate unit.

The reason for this construction is to make the whole unit more easily transported if the need arise.


To construct the unit in oak would cost six hundred and sixty seven pounds (£667.00) excluding Vat. A reduction of some ten per cent could be made with the use of mahogany, but this could also lead to a reduction in the quality of finish, mahogany blockboard being rather more open in the grain.
