Dear Dr Gordon

Firstly I would like to thank you and Mrs Gordon for your hospitality when I called last week.

As promised I am sending you a copy of our invitation letter and apologise sincerely on behalf of the Forestry Commission for not having invited the principal guest. That really is a very serious omission but I am quite sure you will not take it amiss.

Anyhow, to make amends I attach a copy now, also a copy of the programme for the day. From this you will see that Mr Morrison will introduce you, not myself as we had discussed.

Paragraph 2 of the programme for the day is merely a statement of our discussion last week. The programme timing also may be of interest to you.

Regarding the actual cutting of the tape, or ribbon, the choice of weapons I leave to you. My own feeling was that a sgian dubh might be more suitable than a pair of scissors, but Mr Paterson wondered if you would prefer to use a sword or claymore to make it a more picturesque ceremony. We could go the whole way and get a two-edged battle axe, but the Health and Safety at Work Act might preclude this! Seriously however, it is entirely up to you whether you cut the tape with scissors, a sgian dubh or a sword (perhaps borrowed from Lady Grant who seemed to have plenty at Monymusk House)



I suppose really what we have to consider is how it will look in the press, and I leave it to your good judgement and experience in this sort of thing to make a suitable selection. If you wished to use a light hand axe for example, we would need to have a wooden post driven into the ground across which the tape rested so that it could be cut on the top of the post.

Perhaps when you have considered all the possibilities you will find that the sgian dubh is the easiest carried, the least likely to lose, the simplest to use and perhaps the most fitting.

Please do not hesitate to ask me if you have any other problems, and if I do not hear from you before, I look forward to seeing you on the day.

COSSON'S CAR PARK AND FORD T AND HILL WALKS: BESTACHIES

BACKGROUND MOTES

The third Forestry Commission Car Park to be constructed on Bonnachie Forest is to be opened on 10 May 1978 at 3 pm by Dr D G Gordon, Senior Bailie of the Bailies of Bonnachie. The Commission has been encouraged to expand its facilities by the excellent response to and use of the facilities installed in recent years.

Situated beneath the Mither Tap on its eastern flank with access from the Monymusk to Pittodrie and Chapel of Garioch road and 25 miles from Abordoen, the new car park has capacity for 20 cars. From this leads off a forest walk, on gentle gradients by a pleasant burn and a steep walk through forest to the Mither Tap. The latter gives grand views over the Garioch and the Buchan landscape.

The Mither Tap stands sentinel over the Car Fark which has been carefully screened in a 35 year-old larch and pine plantation. Also seen from the entrance to the Car Park is Essen's croft. The name of the last occupant of this abandoned holding has been chosen for the Car Park to commemorate the pioneer spirit and endeavour of the settlers who fermarly wrested a living cut of the granite slopes, now clothed in forest.

Around 1821 John Esson married the daughter of the stone mason who, in 1801, had built a house and started to reclaim small fields from the heathery granite wilderness. John shared in this toil and other settlers joined them nearby. Then, in 1859, the settlers were forced to become tenants and, in hard times when rents could not be paid, they were evicted one by one until only John Esson remained. He defied eviction until he died and is now part of the history of this period. (Refer 'The Book of Bennachie', published by the Bailies.)

From today the public will be able to walk past these relies of former endeavour and hardship and enjoy the forest and hill walks, with perhaps a thought for former times before the tractor and before North Sea oil.

A feature of the Walks is the standard of construction and surfacing of the Lower Forest Walk and the first section of the Walk to Mither Tap. Boulders have been removed and surfacing of fine granite rolled in.

The Car Park forms a new base for ridge walking on Bennachie and Millstone Hill and traverses can be made to the other two Forestry Commission Car Parks at Donview and Back o' Bennachie.

Bennachie has for many years been very popular as an outing with the Nor! East folk in Aberdeen, Dyce, Inverurie and Kintore. We hope this new provision will be as popular with newcomers to the Area, and introduce them to the pleasures of quiet walks in the forest, with beckoning glimpses of the ridge of Bennachie from which such magnificient views can be obtained. There is something for the less nimble and something for the sprightly - come along and try it. And remember to take extreme care to prevent fire - fire could destroy what everyone wants to come and enjoy.
