Thank you for your letter of 13 February 1995 and a sight of the procedure guide for applying Davidson

Going through the details that you have raised in the form, I can only suggest the following ways forward.

- Application to Provide Funding. I would suggest that as an applicant, you would be one of a number of groups and bodies interested in the proposal and collectively would be trying to secure a target sum of £100,000.
- Finanacial Viability of the Project. The project will not be self-financing because of its b. nature as being a series of paths used by the public at no charge. The project's aim is to ensure the provision of high standard paths which will require minimum maintenance in the future. This maintenance will be provided on a regular ongoing basis.
- Brief Description of Project. I suggest at this stage we should not submit the "Footways C. for the Future" brochure as it would possibly be an overkill of the term brief description. You are very well acquainted with the project and concept and I am sure you could pull together a few words which will cover the proposals in brief put pertinent detail.
- d. Grant Level. I suggest that you set this at £40,000.
- Date of Application. I suggest you set this at May 1995. e.
- f. Completion of Project. I suggest you set this as September 1997.
