## ALLEGED PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY ESSONS CROFT, BENNACHIE

I refer to your memorandum of 31st May 1994 regarding the above and have investigated the matter.

Although there would undoubtedly have been some historical use of the trackway from the former colony to the public road near Tullos the track itself does not appear to lead to anywhere in particular at its western extremity. It is one of the essential criteria to establish public rights of way that they lead from one public place to another and as this element is clearly missing I do not believe the trackway has right of way status.

I can also confirm that it does not appear on the maps made available by the Scottish Rights of Way Society.
