On a visit to Gordon district the Prince was asked to join with volunteer group the Bailies of Bennachie in preserving the area.

The nature-loving prince was presented with a book on the Bailies while officially opening the £400,000 Bennachie Centre.

It was in the news recently when it was revealed the ceremony would happen before it was ready to open full time.

However it was full today with exhibition material and local dignitaries and representatives of bodies involved in the centre. The Prince spent some time studying display material around the custom-built centre near Chapel of Garioch.

Senior Ranger Fred Gordon, who will be based at the centre, said Prince Charles asked him how the local ranger service was organised.

Mr Gordon said: "We spoke about the difficulties of organising volunteers and he seemed genuinely interested in conservation."


The prince lingered longest with pupils from the primary schools of Clatt and Monymusk and Chapel of Garioch, who had prepared impressive projects for the special visit.
