L telephone numbers in Inverurie Il change to five figures during ne currency of the 1974 telephone irectory published this week.

To obtain a new number, callers should prefix part of the old number by 20 or 21: for instance, numbers commencing with 2 like 2699 become 20699 and numbers commencing with 3 like 3499 become 21499.

These new numbers should not be used until advised. They should then be used in conjunction with the codes shown in the dialling cade booklet.
