## Two die in Orkney road accidents

A SCHOOLBOY and a farm worker died in two separate accidents in Orkney at the weekend.

The tiny community of Pierowall, on the island of Westray, was shaken by the death of fourteen-year-old Neil Drever, Swanson's Cottage, after he had been knocked down by a car near Pierowall early yesterday morning.

Neil was walking along the road with a friend on his way home from a Saturday night

dance when the accident happened.

A pupil of Pierowall Junior Secondary School, Neil was third oldest of a family of five —four sons and one daughter. His father, Mr George Drever, is assistant manager at Westray's crab factory.

Kenneth Annal (29), 9 Hatston Houses, Kirkwall, died when the car he was driving left the road and was wrecked near Netherbutton on the main Kirkwall-Holm road early on Saturday.

No other vehicles were involved and he was the sole occupant.

He was married and has a child.
