Although much of this habitat remains free from grey squirrels, greys had begun to spread out of Aberdeen city and across Aberdeenshire, particularly down the river corridors of the Don and Dee.

Red squirrels had been disappearing from many areas including

much of Aberdeen city.

With further populations currently at risk the North East Scotland Red Squirrel Project aims to prevent the greys from spreading and so endangering the reds.

Stephen's talk will discuss the many and complex issues involved.
